PISTOL LEAGUE:

The Rim-fire Indoor .22 Pistol League has started on 1/31. You can still catch up to us or just shoot for fun! We meet every Sunday between 1 and 3 p.m. Each relay shoots 60 shots at both 7 and 10 yards, totaling 120 rounds, at speeds of slow, timed and rapid fire. The fees are \$10 to join and \$2 for each relay that you shoot at (\$30 would be total cost for the season) and will be held for a total of 10 weeks. We will have cash prizes at the end (50% of the money collected to the top shooters) OR will give out certificates and donate the money to the club for the outdoor pistol range.

It looks like we'll have about 40 people this year, which is twice what we had last year.



The upstairs bar will be open, serving soda, beer, candy, bars or cookies and hot dogs (no beer before shooting please). At later meets (if people like the food) we'll switch off with ham slices,

pulled beef or pork and maybe hamburgers on the grill.

PLEASE come try this out, it's a HOOT. No pressure, bring what you have to shoot and we'll fit you in.

We will also be having different raffles this year, both during the Pistol League and later on. Pistol League will have a raffle for a Remington Camo .22LR 597 Rifle to start.
